# Ambitions for Europeana

- *Enriching and diversifying collections and users experience - reaching more than 30 Million objects by 2015*
  - *Improve functionalities – interactivity – multilingual aspects, new ways of searching, displaying and re-using content*
  - *Engage with new user groups and broaden the use, for example in educational contexts*
- *A hub for the creative industries*
  - *Step up efforts for wider use of content*
  - *Explore re-use scenarios*
  - *Inspire creation of content and new online services*
  - *Facilitate economic activity based on digitised cultural resources.*
- *A platform also for in-copyright material*
  - *Full respect of the underlying intellectual property rights*

# FURTHER DEVELOPMENT OF EUROPEANA THE COUNCIL CONSIDERS THAT IT IS NECESSARY TO

- *Increase the number of objects, both public domain works and works covered by intellectual property rights....*
- *... ensure the widest availability of public domain works after their digitisation.*
- *... find a better balance between the different types of content*
- *... increase the number of objects from libraries, museums, archives and audiovisual collections*
- *... promote ....the widest access for users to content*
- *... Ensure a central place for the user*
- *encouraging interactivity by enabling users to make an active contribution to the site*
- *ensure that content is uploaded in respect of the relevant legal provisions*
- *Where possible... use open formats*
- *....facilitate appropriate re-use and adaptation*

# *The new Renaissance*



## **Report of the Comité de Sages**

- Presented to the Commission on 10 January 2011
- Stresses the economic aspects next to the cultural aspects
- 'Access' is the central concept
- Digitisation is more than a technical option, it is a moral obligation

# *Access to and use of public domain material*



## ***The issue***

- Access to and use of the material not guaranteed
- Status and practices differ within Member States

## ***Key recommendations:***

- Make digitised public domain material widely available for access and use
  - Avoid intrusive watermarks
- Unify the rights status of digitised public domain material
- Make metadata widely and freely available for re-use

# Openness

- Open software
  - Distributed peer production and review, quality software, wide availability
- Open content and metadata
  - The digitised public domain material should be as open as possible for access by the citizens and for use in new products and services, and the same goes for the descriptions of the content.
- The potential of linked data
  - Cultural material can become an important pillar of the Commission's open data strategy that will be outlined later this year in connection with the review of the Directive on the re-use of public sector information.
  - The successful 'hackathons' experience

# The Commission's strategy

- Political level:
  - work with Member States - Recommendation coming soon
- Financial level:
  - CIP ICT PSP Programme
  - RTD on digital cultural and semantic technologies



# EU funding 2005-2011\*

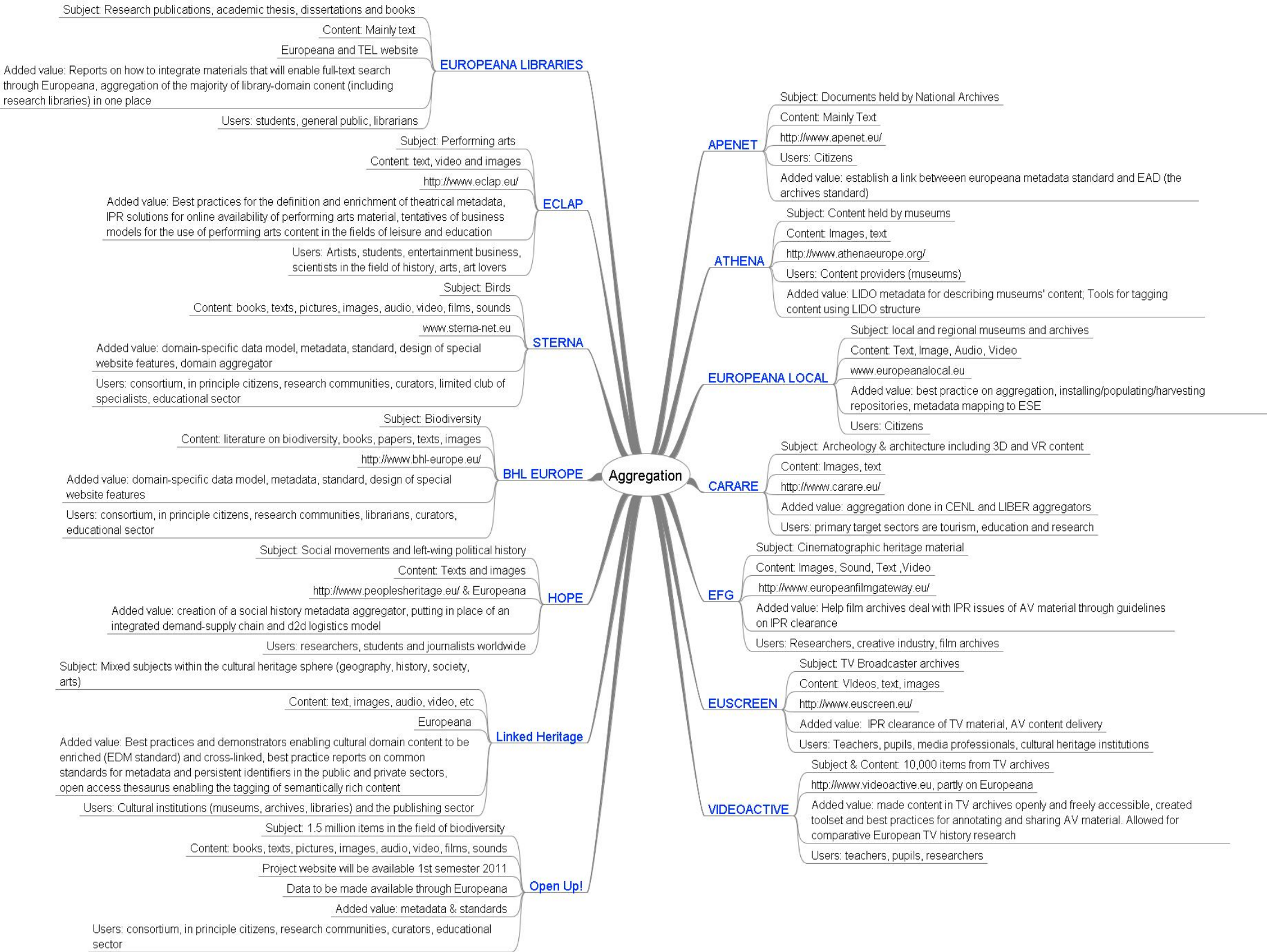
## Europeana and wider area of digital libraries

- *~145 M€ funding to target area cultural content/digital libraries*
- *~51 projects contributing to Europeana and wider accessibility of European cultural heritage*
  - *covering content from e.g. National Libraries, National Archives, film archives, TV broadcasters and local cultural institutions*

CIP ICT PSP Programme - 23 projects overall (of which 11 under negotiation) 77.5 M€

- Core platform: 3 projects
- Aggregation: 11 projects
- Digitisation: 9 projects

# Orientations on digital content, open data and creativity

- Open Data (GI, OA, PSI, CH) - continue the competition experiments

# The New Financial Framework (2014 -2020)

- In June 2011, the Commission's proposed a multi-annual budget for 2014-2020.
- It includes a significant increase to Research and Innovation funding (Horizon 2020).
- It also proposes to support a Connecting Europe Facility (CEF) that would fund cross-border projects in energy, transport and information technology to strengthen the backbone of the internal market
  - ICT broadband and digital services infrastructure 9.2€ Billion

# Technology futures for Europeana

- To develop technologies for Europeana to become the reference point for Europe's cultural heritage online
  - Interactivity – multilingual aspects, new ways of searching, displaying and re-using content
  - Build on the potential of social networks to facilitate the interaction of the users around the digitised material
  - Finding ways to facilitate the use of digitised material and related object descriptions for innovative services and products
  - ...
